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Dear Sir or Madam,

The Ministry of Justice, Finland, is conducting a small-scale comparative study regarding *the use of bail* as an alternative to pre-trial detention in selected European countries. The aim is to gain information of *experiences of the use of bail*.

Finland most politely asks you to answer the following questions:

1. *Equality before the law* and the bail system: Has thought been given to the equality of people before the law on the one hand and on the other hand to the fact that the use of bail system depends on the financial situation of suspects or third parties? If so, how has this been solved?
2. *Efficiency* of the bail system: Have the experiences of the bail system proved efficient in view of its aim? Please provide a short description of your experiences.
3. Questions arising from the *payment of bail*: Has there been experiences that the bail system would encourage the use of means stemming from criminal activity on order to pay the bail?
4. *Use of bail*: how much is bail used
 - a) on a yearly basis (e.g. number of cases or percentage of total number of remand prisoners yearly)?
 - b) in comparison to other alternatives to pre-trial detention?
5. *Need of bail provisions*: How relevant do you deem the bail system in comparison to pre-trial detention and other alternatives to it?

If the relevant legislation and/or preparatory works are available electronically in English, German, French or in Nordic languages, please be so kind to attach links to relevant web sites. Scanned pages of related materials, e.g. commentaries or references to relevant literature, in these languages are most welcome.
