General

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The purpose of safety investigation is to promote general safety, the prevention of accidents and incidents, and the prevention of losses resulting from accidents.

A safety investigation is not conducted in order to allocate legal liability. (Safety Investigation Act 525/2011)

The Safety Investigation Act (525/2011) is a national regulation, which is also a unifying framework for EU and international legislation.

The Safety Investigation Authority is connected to the Ministry of Justice, not under the ministry. The Authority carries out its tasks independently and impartially.

The Safety Investigation Authority is positioned in such a way that it is outside the supervisory authorities and regulators.

The budget for safety investigations is flexible, so it cannot guide the agency's independent decisions.

The Safety Investigation Authority may issue orders on the technical conduct of safety investigations.

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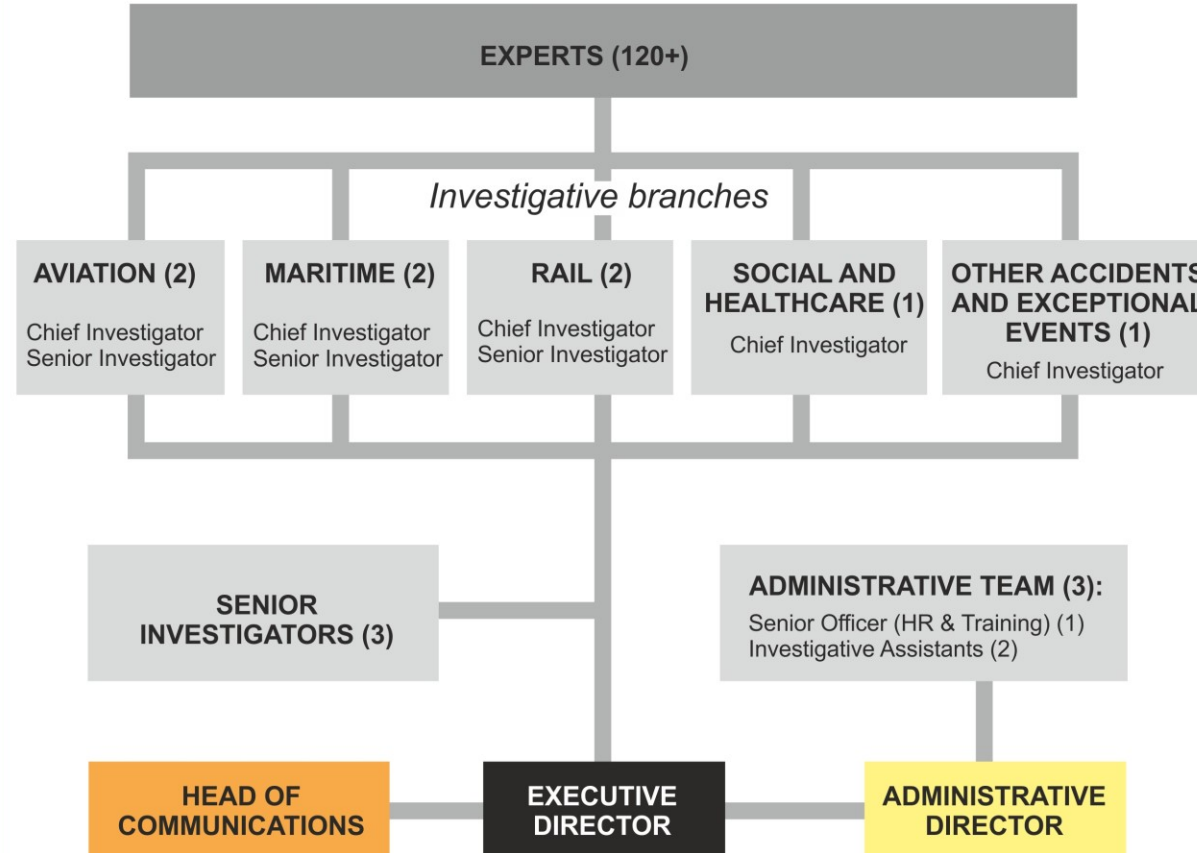
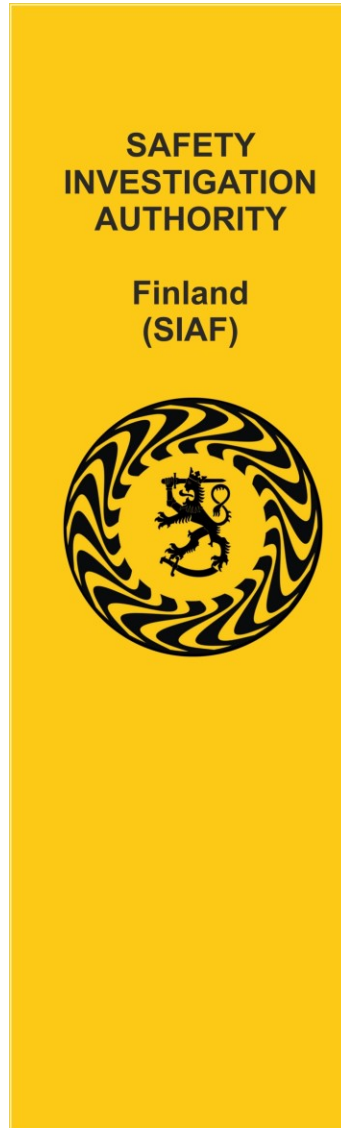

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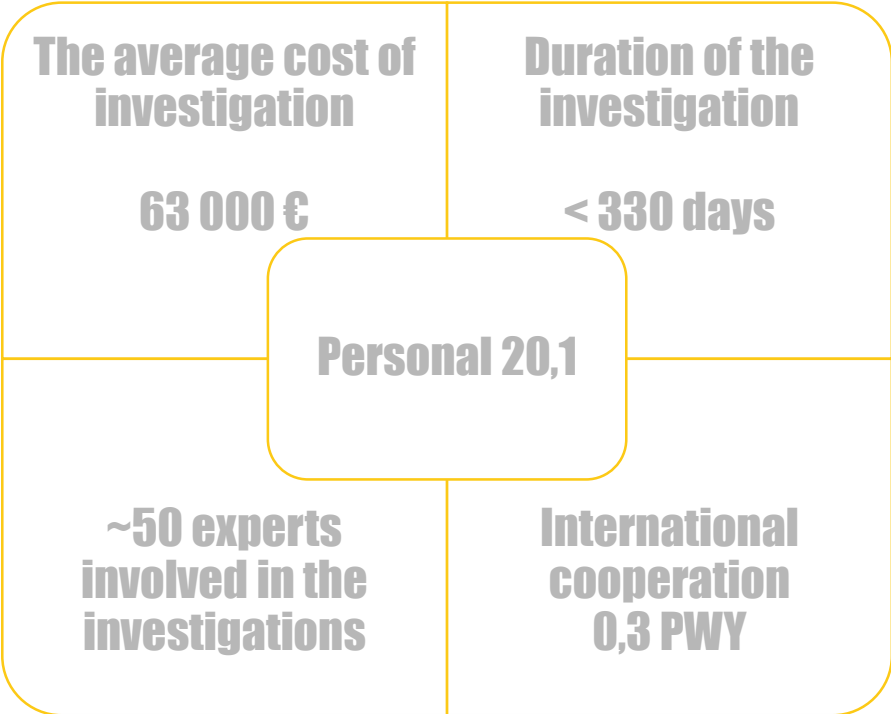
